Water Report

Alan Grell reported that the blending station project is moving forward slowly. It has been discovered that the maps and what have been found in the ground do not match up so more excavation will need to take place and cap certain underground piping to appease the state inspectors. The village well that is showing high nitrate levels is currently offline unless needed for emergency use. That means the well currently running has increased output to maintain water levels here in the village. By doing this it has created turbidity (air in the



water). This will continue until the blending station is completed. Grell also stated that water samples are still sent to the state every month and the water is safe to drink.

Alan Grell stated that waste water treatment repairs to start Monday. The sludge pump is back in operation and material can be sent to the holding pond if needed. Once the repairs have been made Grell plans to use the microbes he has been holding in the north side to seed the south side. This process should take about two months to stabilize the system and get back to normal operation conditions for the plant.
